The results show that John's reading ability is at the expected level for their age group. By reading more, there are good opportunities for them to improve their reading skill to be above average.

John is placed at **percentile 41**, which reflects an average level of reading ability for their year group.

John's average reading speed was 125 words per minute, indicating that decoding - the ability to recognize and read the words in the text - is functioning well and facilitates fluent reading.

In terms of reading comprehension, John answered 8 out of 8 questions correctly. This suggests that they understand the content well and are able to reflect on and reason about what they read. Continuing to read a variety of texts and discussing them will help them further develop their comprehension skills.

How does John approach a text?


